



CENTENNIAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PROFILE 2009-2010

PERSONNEL

- 39 licensed teachers (20 classroom teachers and 24 specialists/special education teachers)
- 32 support staff (instructional, special ed and computer paraprofessionals, secretary, health office)
- 2 Kids Club site managers and 2 part time assistants
- 5 custodians (3 FTE and 2 part time, includes maintenance of the district offices)
- 3 food service servers and 1 cashier

2009 – 10 SECTIONS BY GRADE LEVEL

Enrollment: 509

- 4 kindergarten (three ½ day kindergarten, 1 K-Plus)
- 4 first grade classrooms
- 4 second grade classrooms
- 3 third grade classrooms
- 3 fourth grade classrooms
- 3 fifth grade classrooms

CHARACTERISTICS OF POPULATION

- 19% free and reduced educational benefits
- 17% eligible for special education
- 20% eligible for Title 1 reading and/or math services
- 28% Eligible for K-5 CERF (Centennial Early Reading Foundations)
- 4% Eligible for ESL direct or indirect services
- Gifted Resources available for eligible students

SPECIAL EDUCATION

- 88 students receive special services
- 37 of those students spend some time in the special education resource rooms. This includes students with learning disabilities, autism, other health disabilities, emotional/behavioral disorders and high functioning DCD.
- 8 of those students are in our center based, district-wide DCD program for low functioning DCD students.
- 43 of those students receive language and speech services
- We also provide office space for District Motor Team (O.T. and P.T.)
- We provide inservice opportunities and training for all staff

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- **Title 1:** Federally funded program services K-5 students who are functioning one or two levels below grade level in math and/or reading.
- **C.E.R.F. (Centennial Early Reading Foundations):** K-5 Reading intervention program
- **C.E.R.F. Extension Day Kindergarten Program:** half-day literacy program to support kindergartners who are significantly struggling. (January through June)
- **Read Naturally and Reading Counts:** reading intervention programs available to children throughout the day
- **English Language Learners (ESL) program:** services provided for students requiring additional assistance learning and maintaining the English language
- **Early Edification:** before-school academic support offered the second half of the school year in math, reading and writing for grades 4-5
- **Centennial Express:** a school program for recommended students in grades 2-5 who would benefit from extra support in academic and social/emotional areas
- **FOCUS:** Non-special ed intervention program which provides services to 30 students who are identified as struggling with friendships and/or having social emotional needs.
- **Centennial High School Honor Students Mentor Program:** 16 high school honor students mentor 16 Centennial Elementary students
- **Centennial High school helper program/HS child development class:** 70 high school students take the child development class for credit and work in classrooms or with specialists to supplement instruction

SUPERVISION/CHILD CARE

- **KIDS CLUB:** Provide before and after school child care for 68 children
- **K-Time:** Provide a half-day, educationally-rich experience for kindergarten students during the time that they are not attending their regular half-time kindergarten session. This year we have 8 children in a.m. and 6 children in p.m. session.

MULTIPURPOSE ROOM

- Provide small group instruction for CERF, Title 1, Native American Education and classroom intervention/re-teaching
- Provide space for mentoring
- Provide a space for a motor room to assist children in developing integrated sensory motor function
