Checklist for Kindergarten Registration

Your child will be completely registered when <u>ALL</u> the following information is received:

Online Registration

Be sure to supply ALL information requested by February 3.

Parent/Guardian Relationship Verification

<u>Birth Certificate</u> showing you as parent or court orders, documents related to guardianship or custody limitations, if applicable.

Pupil Health Immunization Record

Note, children having incomplete immunization records will not be allowed to enter school. Please contact your student's school nurse for health-related questions. For conscientious objectors, please see information on the Minnesota Department of Health's website on the state's immunization law exemption provision at <u>https://www.health.state.mn.us/people/immunize/basics/ exemption.html</u> The form can be found (see page 2 of the form); sign and have the form notarized.

Address Verification - if new to the district

This may include: purchase agreement, lease agreement, or driver's license with address shown, utility bill or a notarized letter, verifying you are living at the address shown on the registration form.

Record of Early Childhood Screening

A copy of your child's Early Childhood Screening is required. ECS is a free check of a child's hearing and vision, weight and height, health history, immunizations, speech and language, general development and motor stills. Minnesota law requires screening before a child can enter kindergarten. If your child was screened through Centennial School District, a copy is already on file. (If you are not sure if your child's screening was completed by Centennial, please call 763.792.6120 to confirm.) If your child was screened by another school district, Head Start, or other provider, please send a copy of the record with your child's registration materials. What is the minimum age requirement for entering kindergarten? Children are required to be 5 years old on September 1 of the school calendar year in which the child attends school.

What are the elementary start and end times (including kindergarten)?

All day Kindergarten	9:17 a.m. – 3:47 p.m.
Kids Club (before and after school daycare)	6:30 a.m until school starts and when school ends until 6:00p.m.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

What if I want to enroll my child in an elementary school outside my boundary? If you wish your child to attend another elementary school within the School District, you need to submit a completed Optional Transfer form by March 15. Each request will be reviewed by the district, and families will be notified by early April. These forms are available on the district website or by contacting the elementary school that resides within your school boundary.

Kindergarten Curriculum Overview

Centennial School District follows Minnesota State Academic Standards in designing the kindergarten experience. Information on these standards can be found at <u>education.mn.gov/MDE/dse/stds</u>.

EVERYDAY STUDIES

Language Arts Classrooms use the Benchmark Advance curriculum to engage students in the formation of language and literacy skills. Instruction focuses on concepts of print, phonemic awareness, phonics, word recognition, various forms of comprehension, and writing.

Mathematics Students read, write, count, compare, order, compose, and decompose numbers. They recognize, complete, and extend patterns. Students begin to understand concepts of number operations, algebra, geometry, and measurement. The core text, Everyday Mathematics, is designed to both extend student learning and circle back to reinforce previously taught concepts and ensure a depth of understanding.

Social Studies Students are introduced to the values and skills integral to the American democratic civic identity. They explore various cultural traditions, explain the importance of rules, and begin to understand the relationship between self, others, and society. Students learn basic economic principles, geographic concepts, and how to talk about the past, present, and future.

Science Students learn how to ask questions, gather, and record evidence through observations, and compare, sort, and analyze data to describe patterns and relationships.

Rotational Studies In addition to the daily learning areas, students participate in Music, Physical Education, and Cybrary on a rotational basis throughout the week.

Music - Students explore, create, and perform sounds, songs, and rhythms through a variety of experiences.

Physical Education – Students move their bodies and learn habits for a healthy life.

Cybrary – Student develop technology skills in creation, coding, and communication. This is also a time to explore the resources with the media center.

Art - Art is integrated into multiple subject areas through a variety of projects and activities.

How Do I Know if My Child is Ready for Kindergarten

Centennial School District wants all children to be successful and to enjoy school. Every child is unique and enters school with a variety of skills. Kindergarten Transportation Information

Transportation for all day, every day kindergarten is available for students who live outside the kindergarten walk area and attend the school that serves their neighborhood. School assignments are based on a student's home address. An alternate address may be selected as the pickup or drop off location if the alternate address is within the same school attendance area as your home and outside the walking boundary. Please note: Due to high levels of vehicle traffic, parents/guardians are discouraged from providing transportation.

Alternate pickup / drop off locations are possible but must be consistent 5 days per week (Monday- Friday). In other words, transportation cannot be provided to or from different addresses on various days. An alternate address may be selected for before school, after school, or both. If an alternate location is requested and the day care and home addresses are in different elementary attendance areas, the school assignment will be based on the day care address.

District personnel understand that things may change after the transportation information is submitted. If so, please contact the <u>Transportation Office</u> with any change requests regarding your child's transportation needs. Transportation assignments will be mailed during the summer.

General Information and Guidelines

- Kindergarteners are generally seated at the front of the bus.
- Parents/Guardians are encouraged to teach their child to wait for the bus driver to wave the child on to the bus for their safety.
- Pick up and drop off locations are determined by the number of children riding the bus and their location. Transportation staff work diligently to ensure that pick up and drop off locations are near each child's destination.
- Pick up and drop off locations within cul-de-sacs and trailer park communities are often limited due to navigation issues.
- Pick up and drop off times are subject to change due to the number of children served and individual school schedules. Parents/Guardians will be notified prior to changes being made.

Immunizations Requirements/Health Information

A student's health may affect his or her learning. Therefore, updated health information is important, this will be held in confidence, and disclosed to school personnel to the extent necessary to protect the health and safety of the student. Please contact your student's school nurse for health-related questions. Pupil Health Immunization Record: **Note, children having incomplete immunization records will not be allowed to enter school.**

Early Childhood Screening (ECS) – ECS is a FREE check of a child's hearing and vision, weight, height, health history, immunizations, speech, language, general development, and motor skills. Minnesota law requires Early Childhood Screening before a child can enter kindergarten. Screenings are held throughout the school year and available by appointment only.

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) – Centennial ECFE offers high quality learning opportunities and resources for families with children from birth to kindergarten age. Families learn and grow together in ECFE through parent and child interaction, guided play and learning experiences, and parent discussion. Join the fun by participating in parent-child classes. <u>Youth Community Education</u> – Activities are listed in the Centennial Community Education Activity Guide produced three times a year. A variety of physical fitness-related activities and sports camps

Sports options for boys and girls beginning at the preschool level

Birthday parties - year round. Several options available including pool time, gymnastics time, gym time or themed craft party Swimming lessons and Gymnastics

Options for preschoolers include Tiny Tots and Poly Wogs for swimming and Wiggle Time and Little Tumblers for gymnastics.

Open swim times offered year-round.

STEM-focused classes

A variety of options including Science Exploration and Beginning Chess.

A variety of fine arts classes including theater, art, and music

Ongoing musical theater classes, dance, and a variety of artistic exploration offerings.

<u>Kids Club</u> – Where we build, we tinker, we paint, we play, we work together, and we create friendships in Centennial Community Education's choice-based school age childcare program. Kids Club offers flexible care options (before, after, Non-School Days (NSD), or any combination) for students in grades kindergarten through 5 at each or our elementary schools from 6:30 am-6:00 pm. Kids Club offers all-day care on Non-School Days and during the summer at select sites.

Summer Kids Club C.A.M.P. - Programming available to families with students entering grades k-6. Students must be toilet trained. Kids Club C.A.M.P. philosophy provides framework for offering an enriching educational and recreational environment that enhances development and encourages children to explore who they are and grow socially through C=creative Arts, A=academic enrichment, M=moovin' & groovin', P=physical fitness.

Students are separated into groups based on similar grade levels. Each room environment features age-appropriate centers with games, blocks, manipulatives, arts, crafts, reading center, and creative play area. Kids Club follows guidance from the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) and Centers for Disease Control (CDC), and provide outdoor recreational experiences, open swim, special interest clubs, and weekly field trips are all a part of Kids Club C.A.M.P.
